

CONTINUED HEALTH SCREENING

The release of COVID-19 vaccines have left many confused when it comes to job-site safety and protocols. *Can COVID-19 Precautions End if All Employees Are Vaccinated?*

The vaccines are only one of several tools in the arsenal used to fight COVID-19. So even after receiving both doses of the vaccines, employers should continue to implement strategies to reduce risks to the safety and health of workers and workplaces from COVID-19 including;

- Conducting daily temperature and health screenings for all employees and visitors
- Screening personnel must be protected from possible exposure and should incorporate standard and appropriate transmission-based precautions
- Any individual showing symptoms of COVID-19 or testing for an elevated temperature should be asked to leave the job site
- Handouts with what to do next should be provided to any employee who has a fever of 100.4 or greater (see self-care instructions)
- Set up signage with CDC recommendations
- Continued requirement of standard safety protocols (frequent hand washing, social distancing and face coverings)

There is still much unknown about the vaccines. Maintaining these precautions will help ensure a higher level of safety for employees, their families and the community at large.
